
KARTING FLAGS EXPLAINED



NATIONAL FLAG

The National flag may be used to signal a race start.



BLUEYou are about to be lapped.





GREN WITH YELLOW

CHEVRON


Restart. Reform on Track.



RED & YELLOW STRIPES


[vertical]

Conditions of the track surface have suddenly deteriorated ahead.




BLACK & ORANGE DISC

To inform Driver that their Kart may have a mechanical/safety problem. Return to the pits immediately.




All racing must cease. No overtaking is permitted.



BLUE & RED DOUBLE
DIAGONAL


Displayed to the Driver who is about to or has been lapped. The driver must stop



WHITE FLAG or LAST
LAP BOARD

Displayed at the commencement of the

last lap.



YELLOW

Danger ahead. Reduce your speed, do not overtake.



BLACK & WHITE WITH
DIAGONAL JOIN
Driver is being observed for unsportsmanlike
behaviour. The Driver must report to the Clerk of



BLACK & WHITE
CHEQUERED

The race is complete. Return to the pits.



GREEN (optional)
All Clear, safe to continue racing.



Return to the pits. The Driver must report to the Clerk of the Course or Steward immediately.
